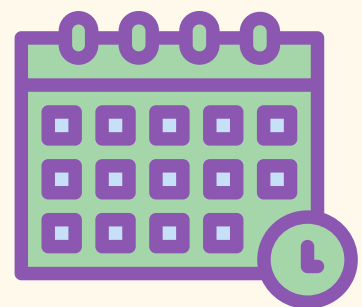

Pet Care Tip

PREPARING FOR SCHOOL TIME CHANGES

The schedule change and busy days can be stressful for your pet as much as it is for you. With kids back in school and work gets busy again, your pets are sitting in the quiet house alone. This change can cause behavioral issues such as destruction of items or repetitive licking that causes hot spots

Ways to help your pet adjust to the change:

Fun Fact...

Carrots should **not** be given as a main part of a rabbits diet.

Carrots are safe for rabbits, but should only be given as an occasional treat. Carrots are mainly sugar and starch, which is hard for a rabbit's digestive system to break down. Since rabbits are physically unable to vomit, digestive irritation and difficulties can become a big problem.

What **should** be in a rabbit's daily diet?

- **rabbit specific grain pellets** (this contains the majority of their nutrients)
- **hay** (high in fiber = better/easier digestion)
- **water** (24/7 access of clean, room temp water)

Other **treat** options that can be great for a rabbit:

romaine lettuce, broccoli, cucumber, turnip, bell pepper, ripe tomato
